The Ethic of what is possible to be done

Doers need to assume the responsibility of what is possible to be done. Unicist Ethics allows assuming this responsibility based on the functional integration of ethical intelligence, strategic intelligence, logical thinking and personal transcendence. It defines the Power an individual has, without exerting it, to produce a predefined work in a unit of Time. Work is the multiplication between the Force of an individual and the Value Adding Displacement produced.

$$\text{Power} = \text{Work} / \text{Time} = \text{Unicist Ethics}$$

$$\text{Work} = \text{Force} * \text{Value Adding Displacement}$$

$$\text{Force} = \text{Process Mass} * \text{Required Acceleration}$$

The strategic intelligence defines the amplitude of the unified field in which specific strategies may be developed.

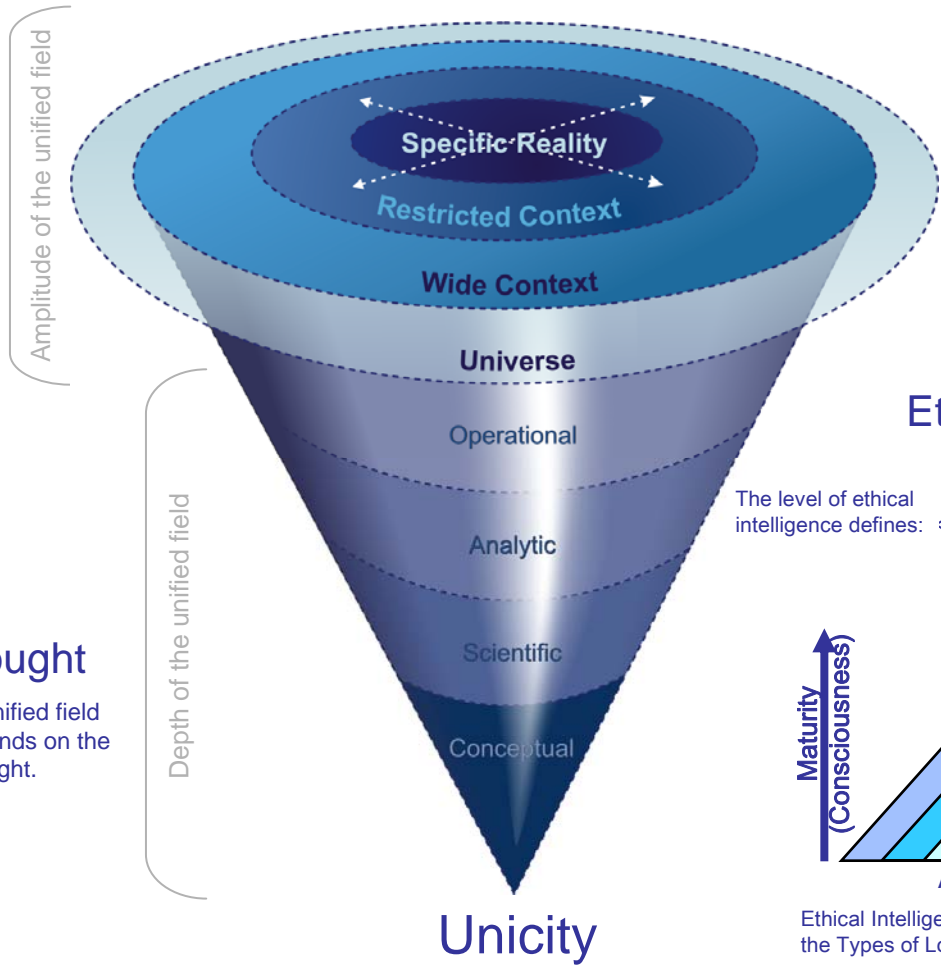
- Freedom Fighter

The depth of the unified field apprehended depends on the type of logical thought.

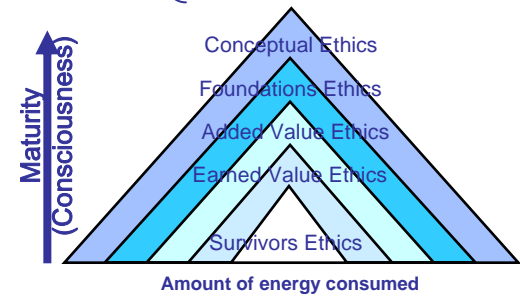
Homological level



- The unified field of a given reality requires the capacity to apprehend it to operate in and with it.
- The restricted context defines the "rules of the game" of any specific reality.
- The wide context within which a given reality is inserted defines its gravitational forces.
- The universe within which a certain reality is inserted defines the limit to be comprehended.
